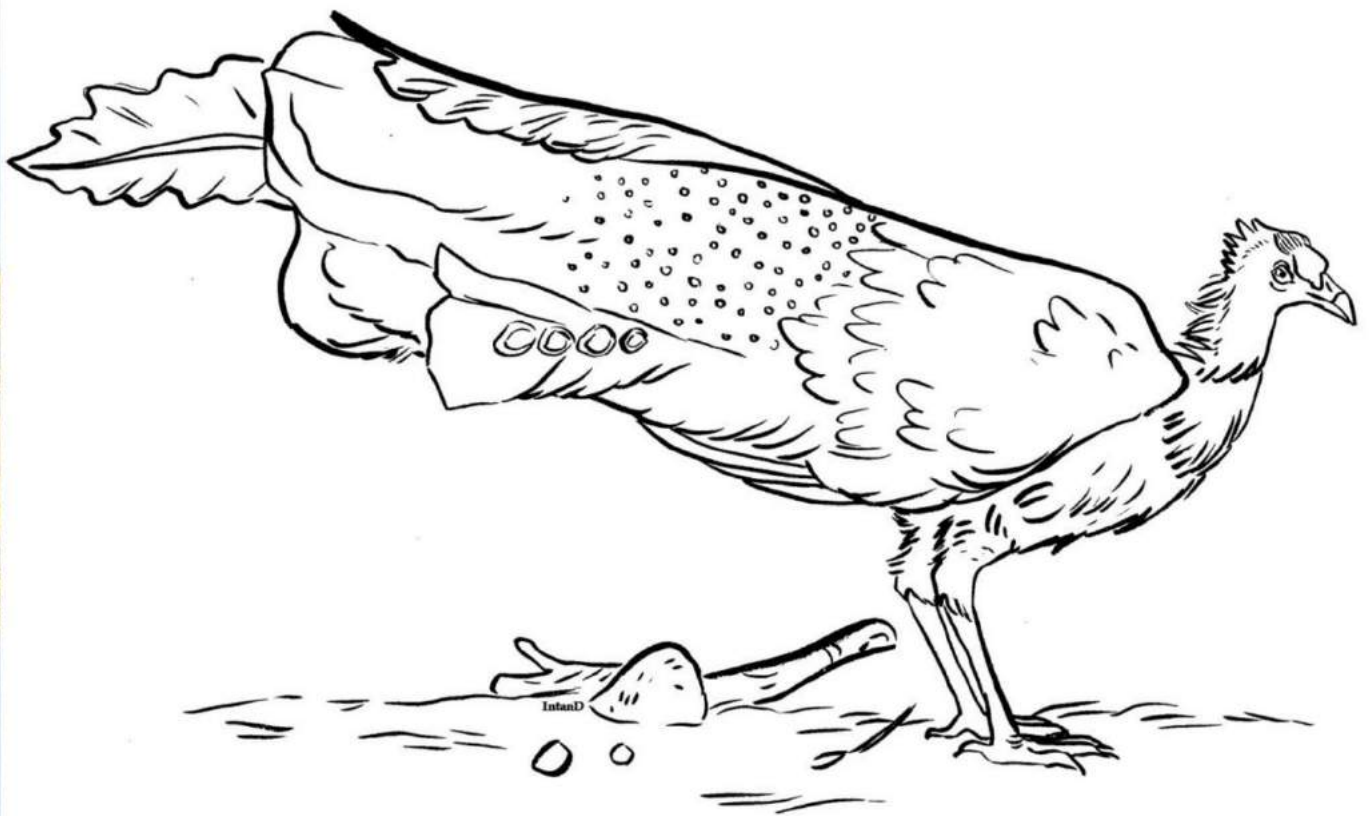


ARGUS PHEASANT

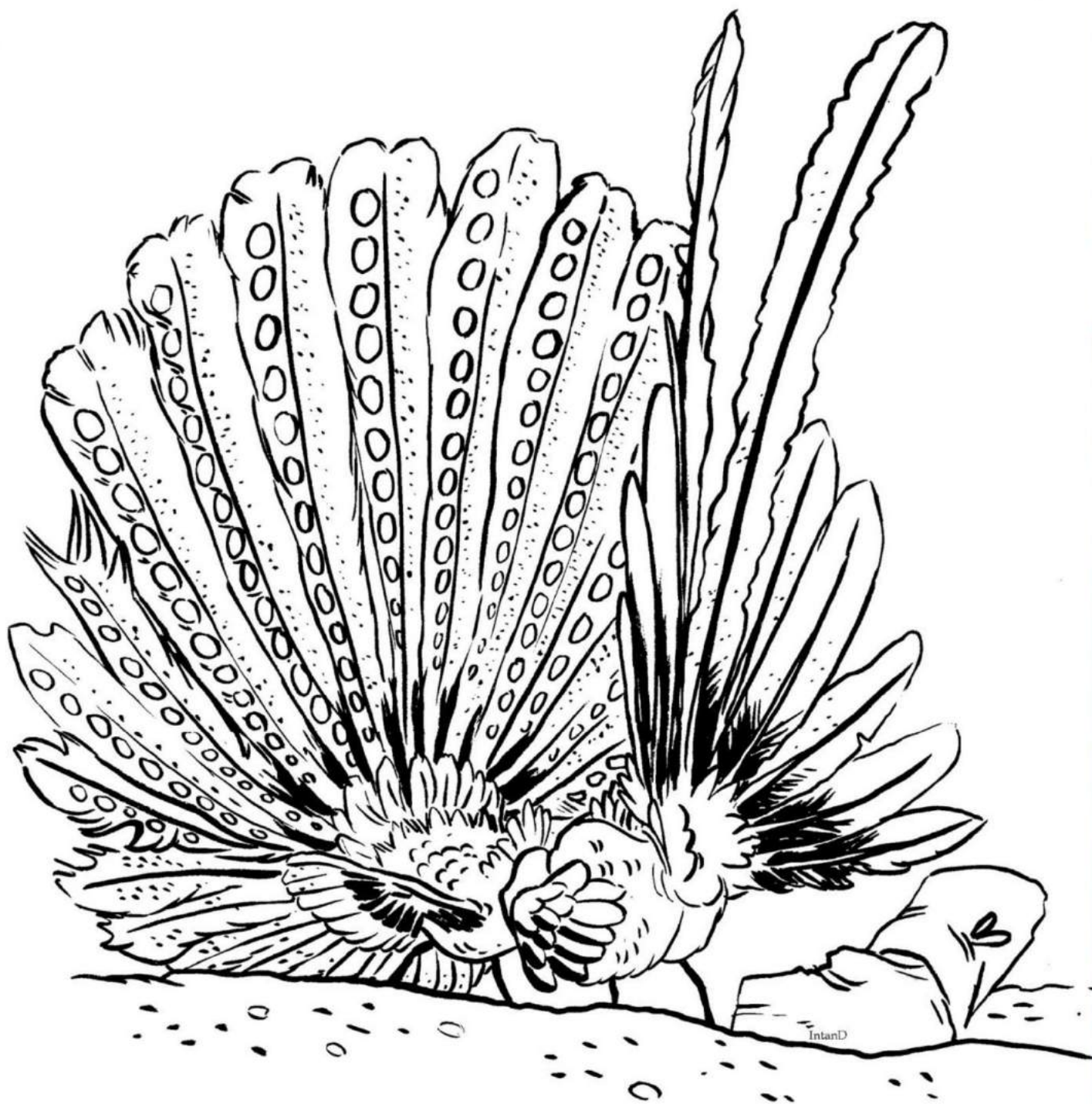




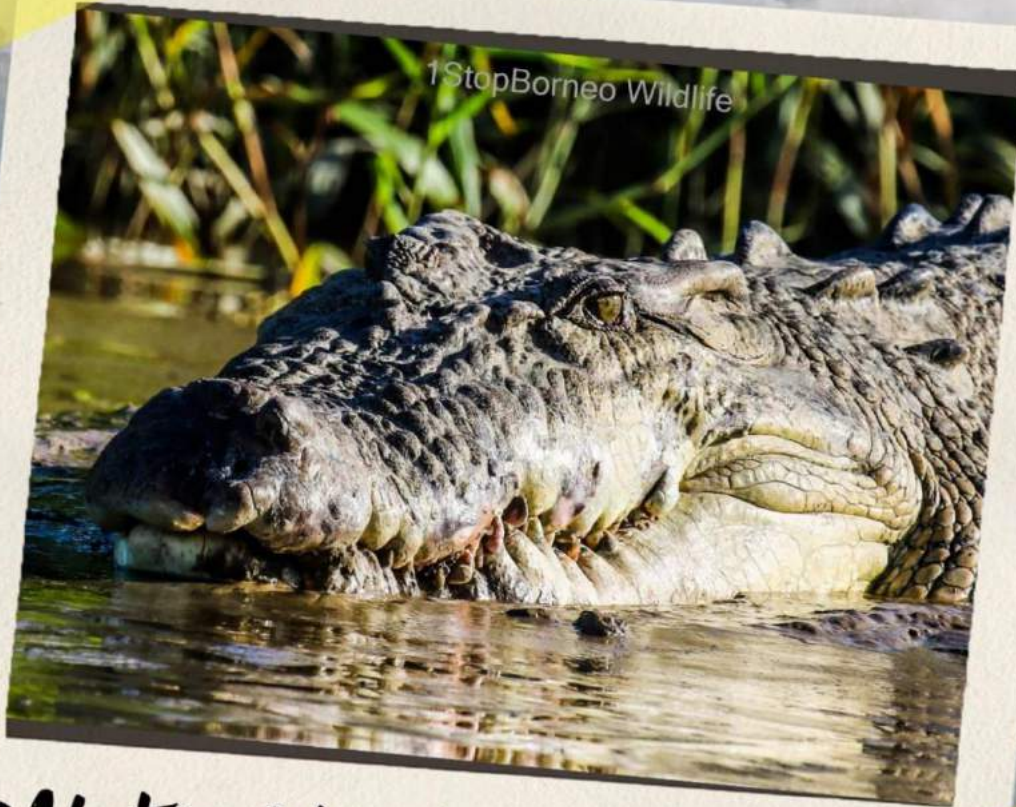
ARGUS PHEASANT

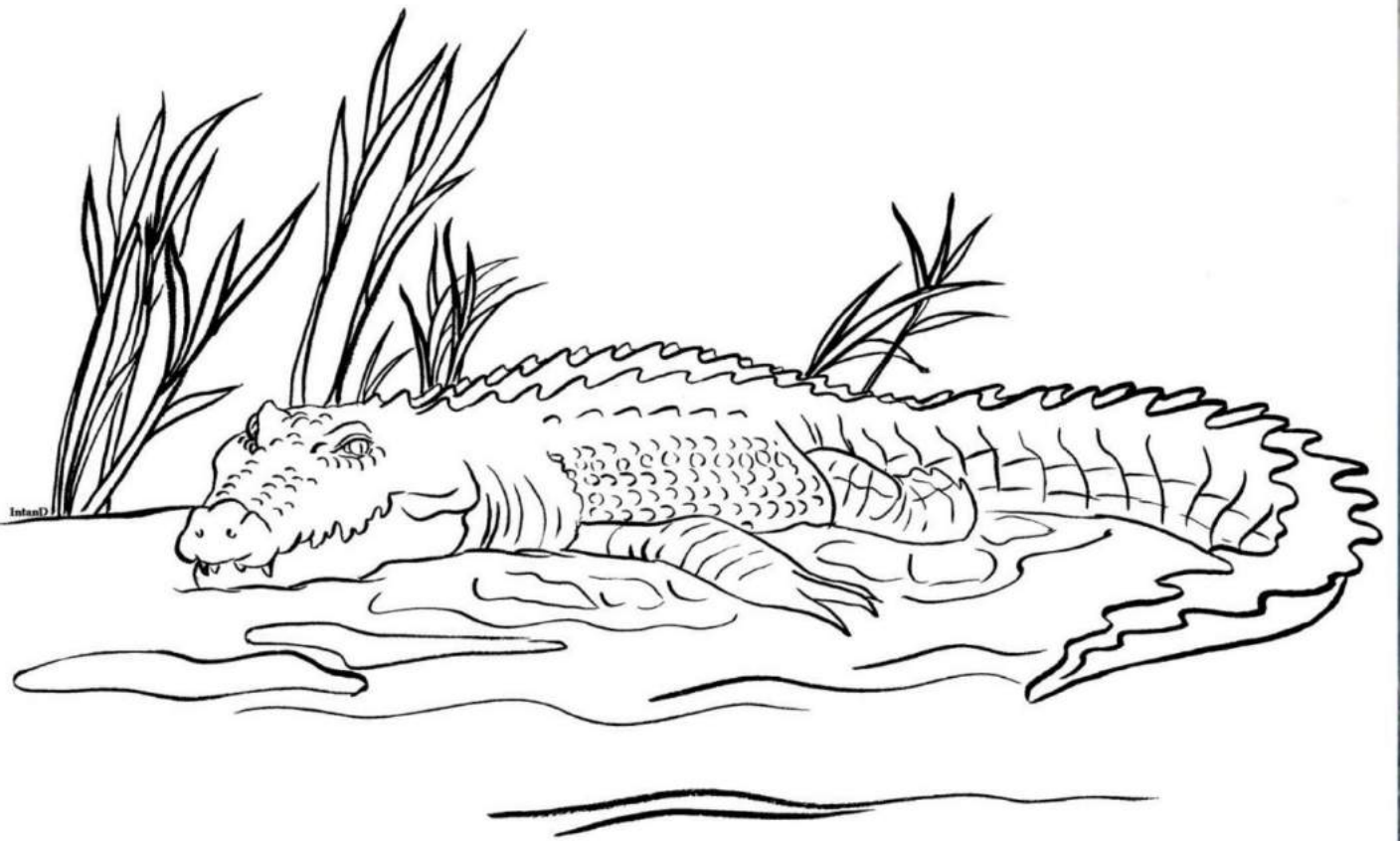


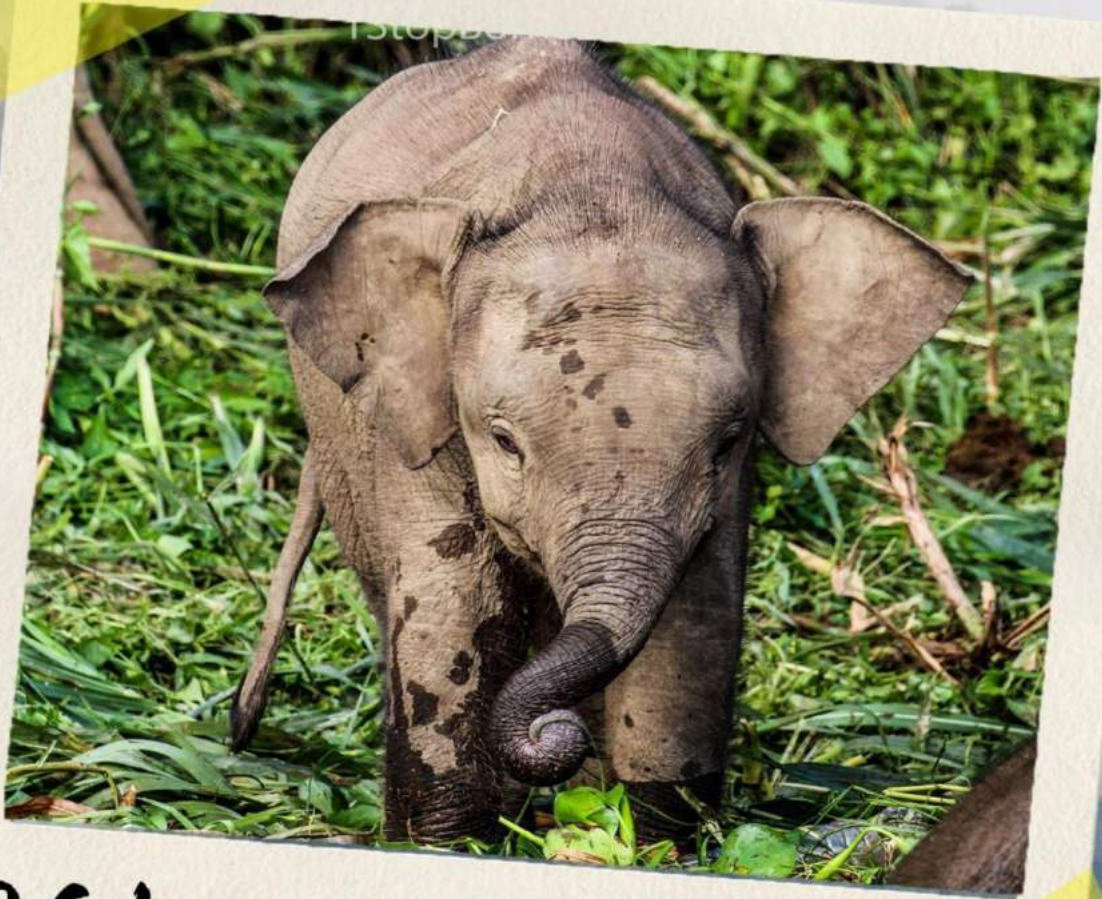
SALTWATER CROCODILE

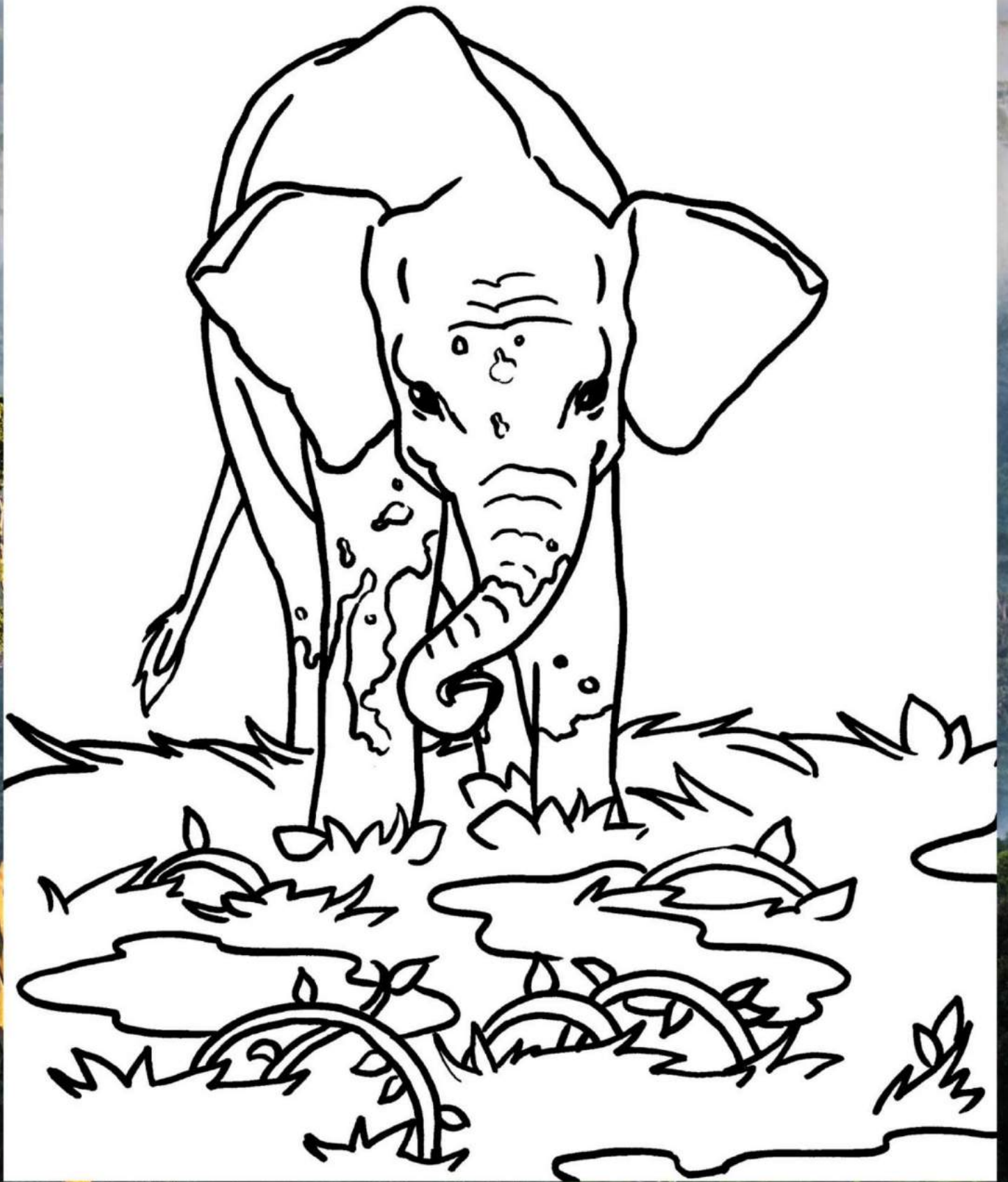
BORNEO ELEPHANT

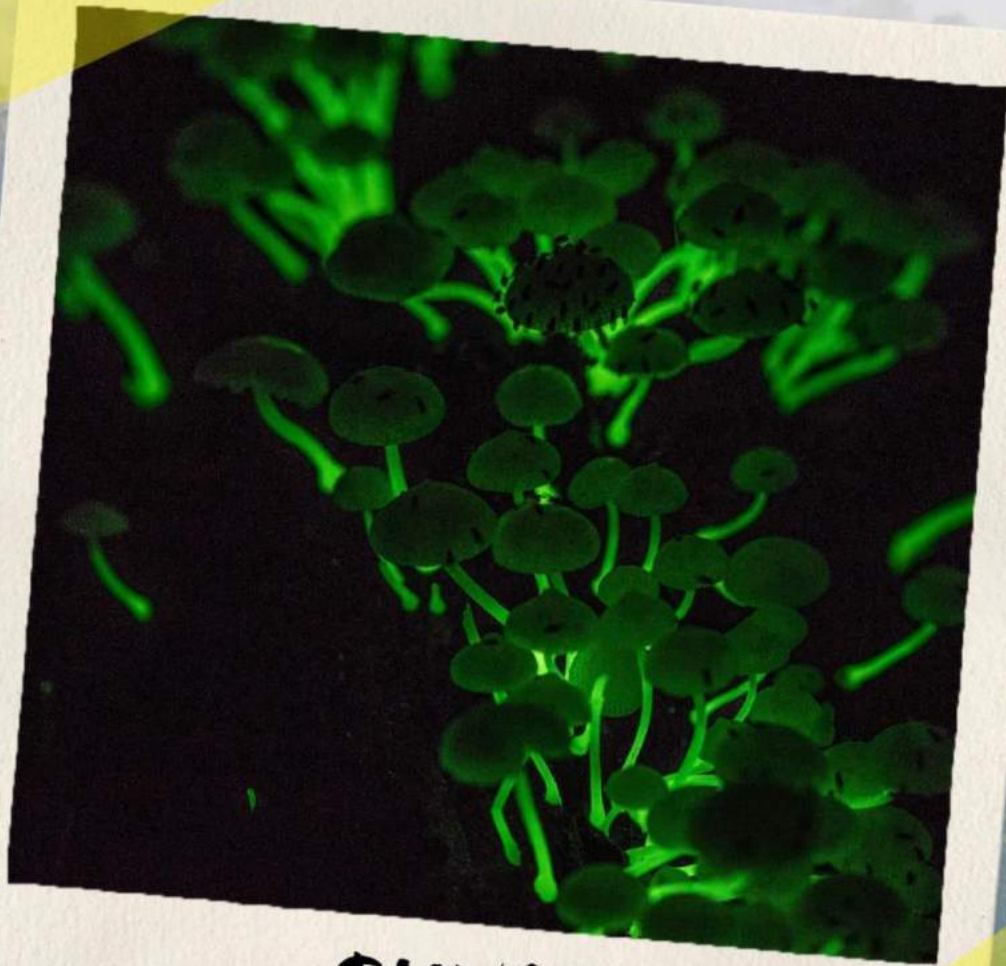
1) World's smallest elephant species

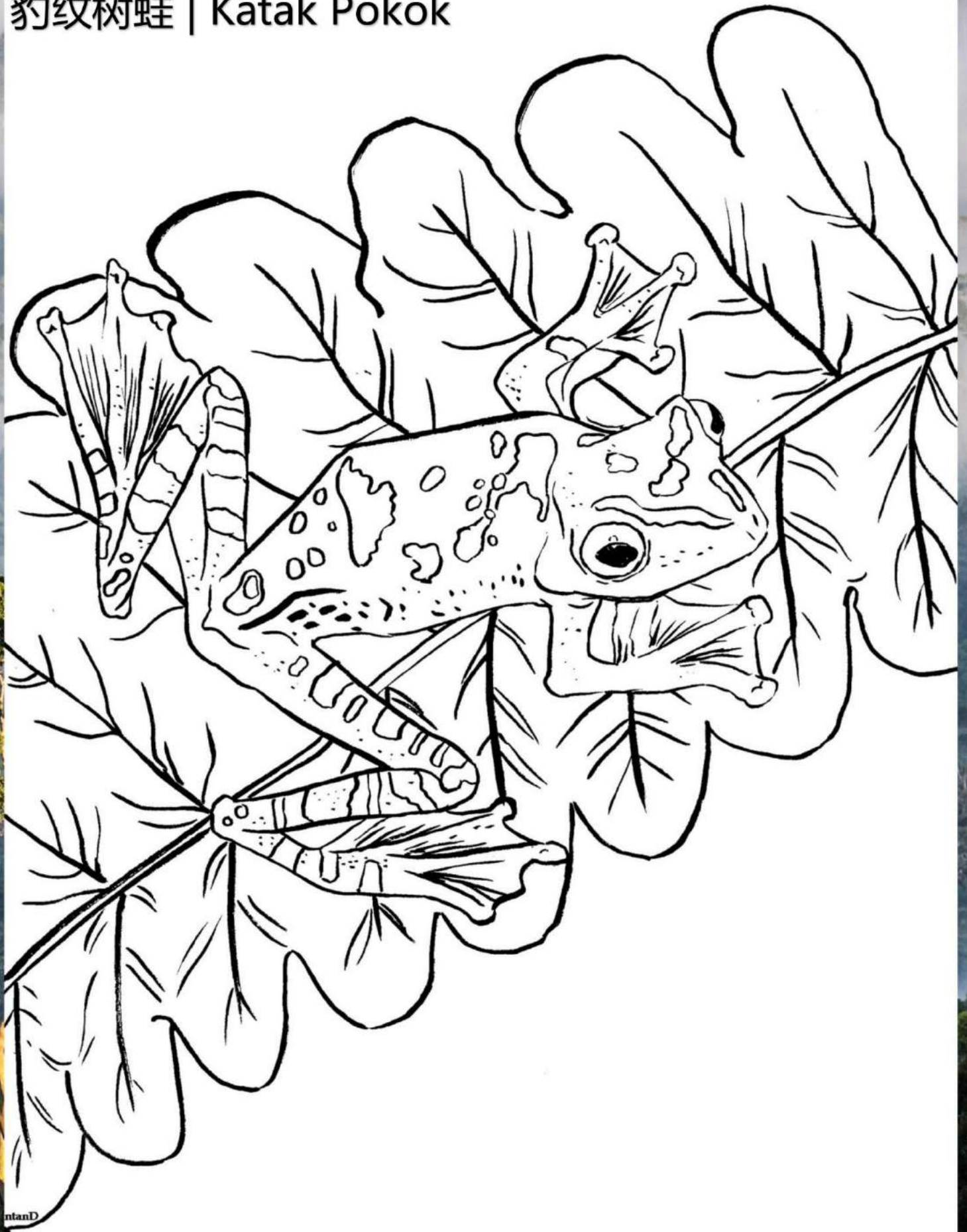


HARLEQUIN TREE FROG

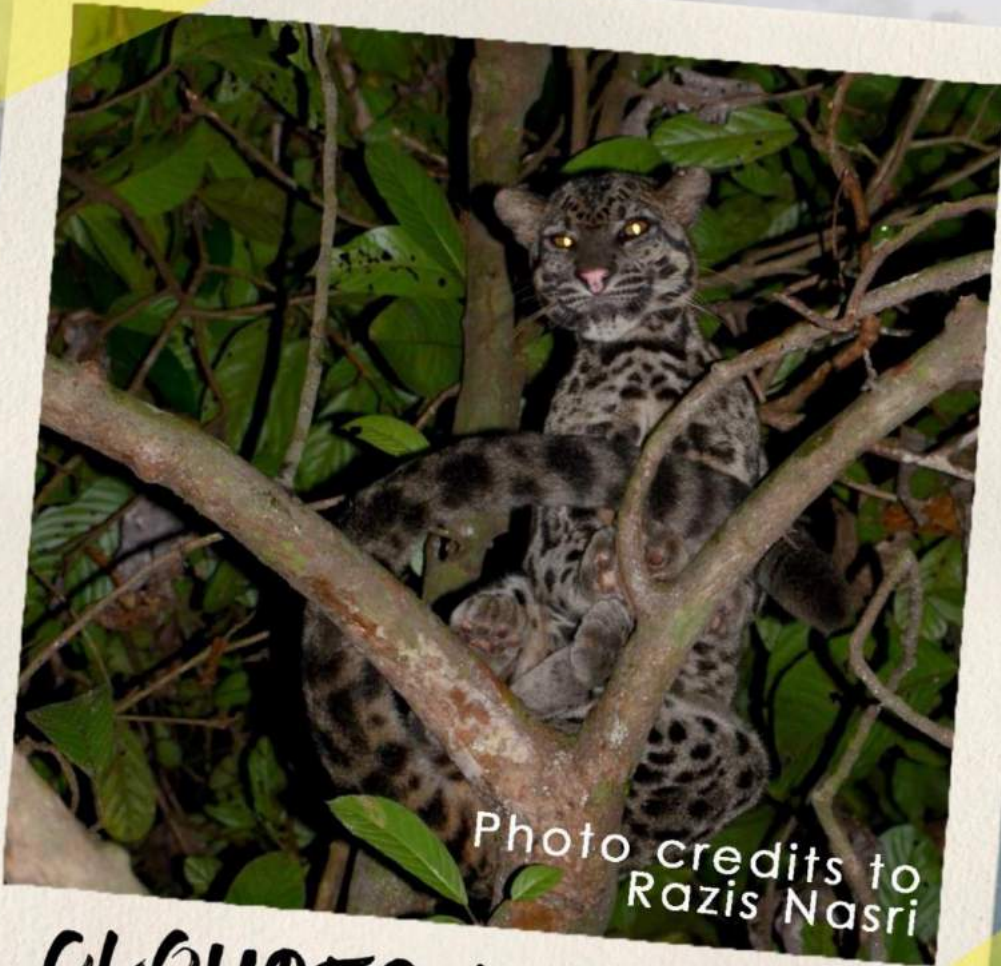

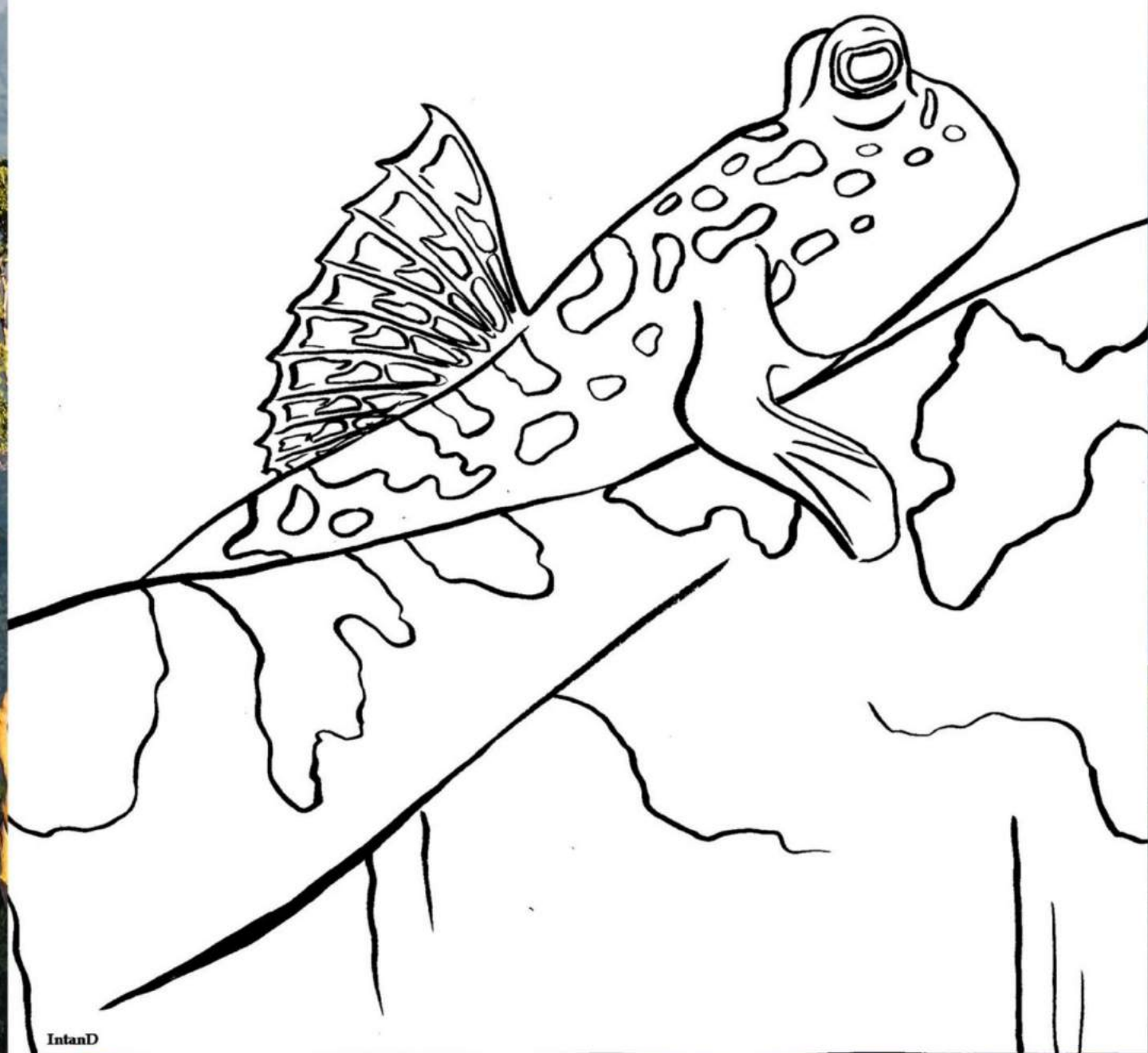


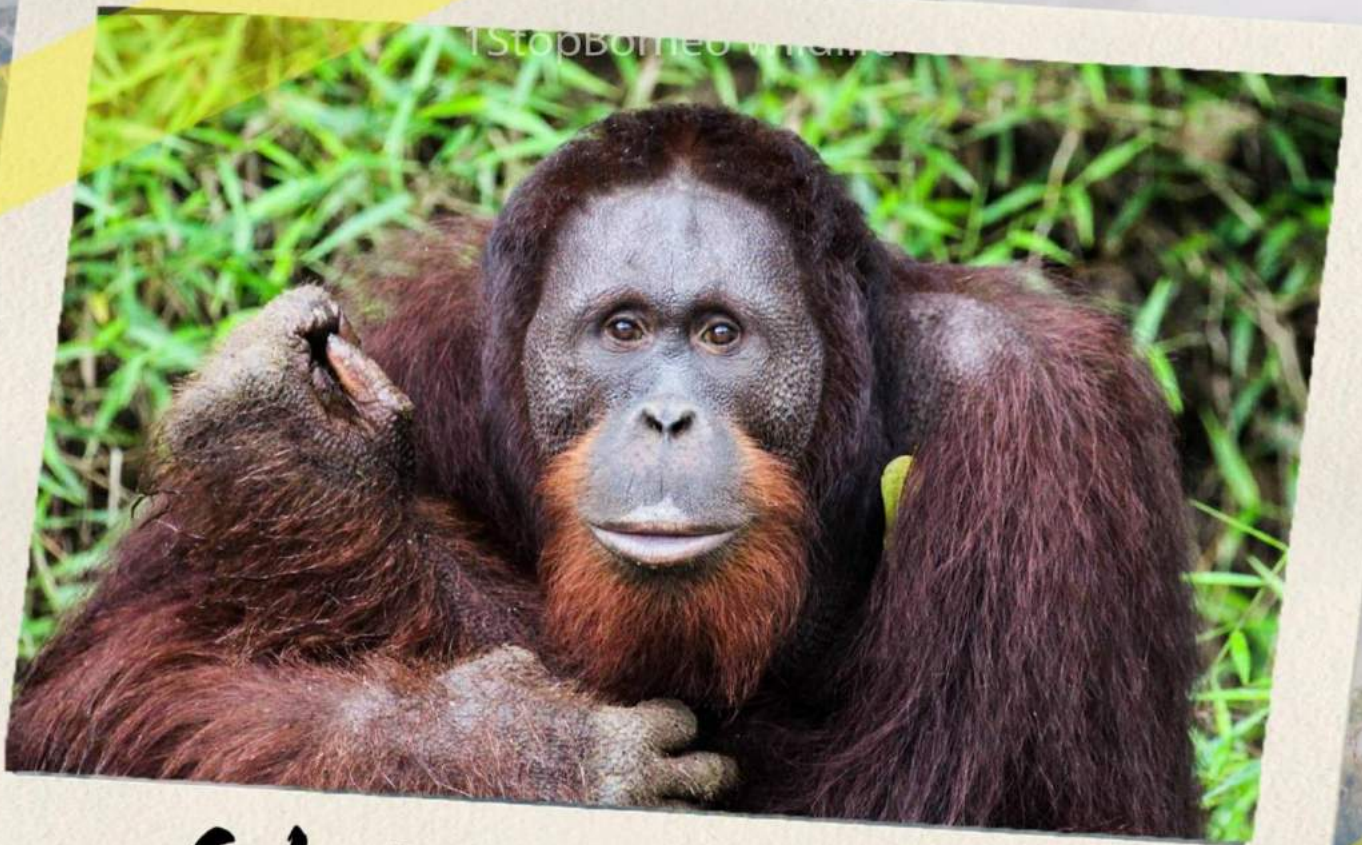
MUD SKIPPER

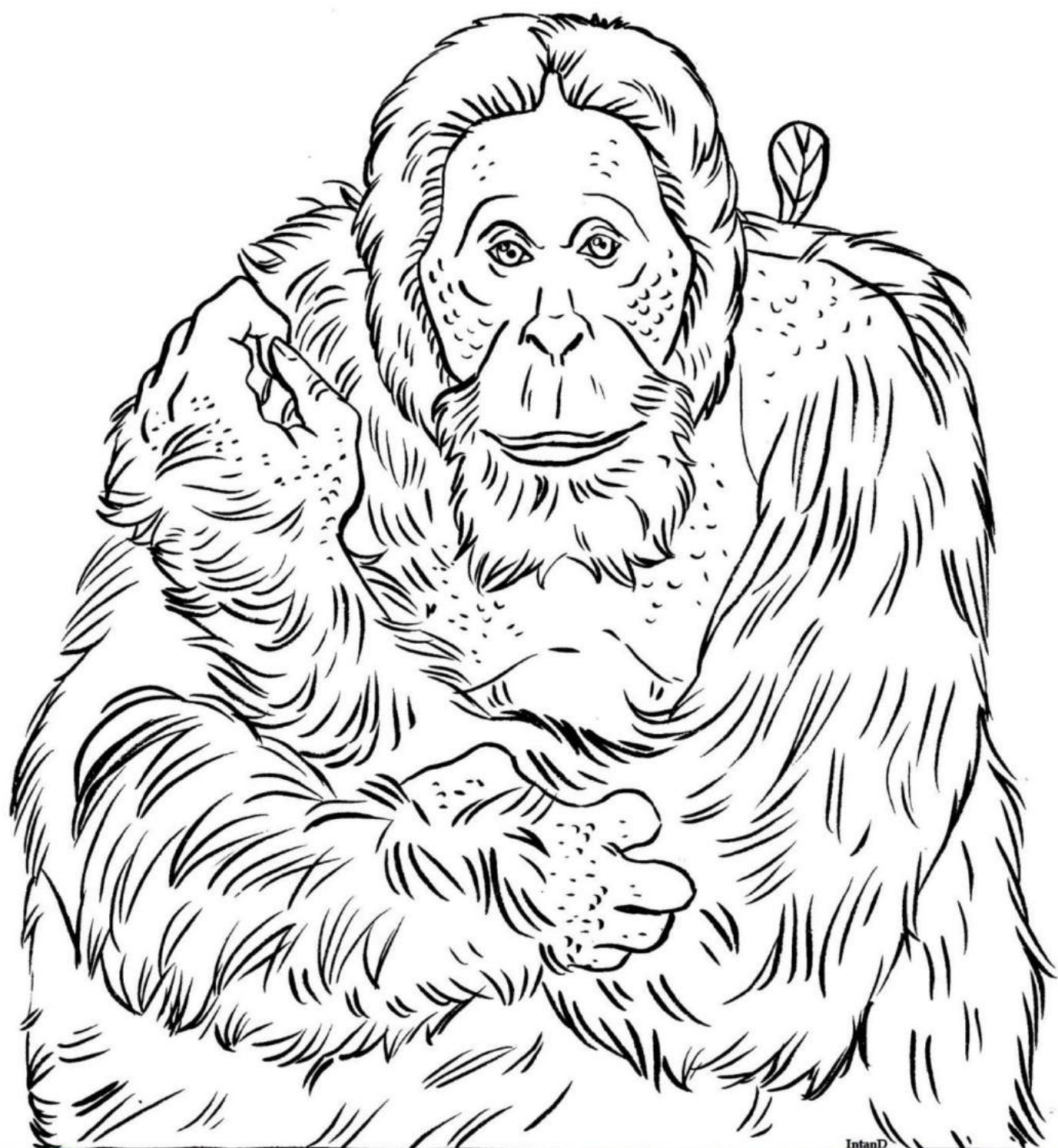




ORANG UTAN

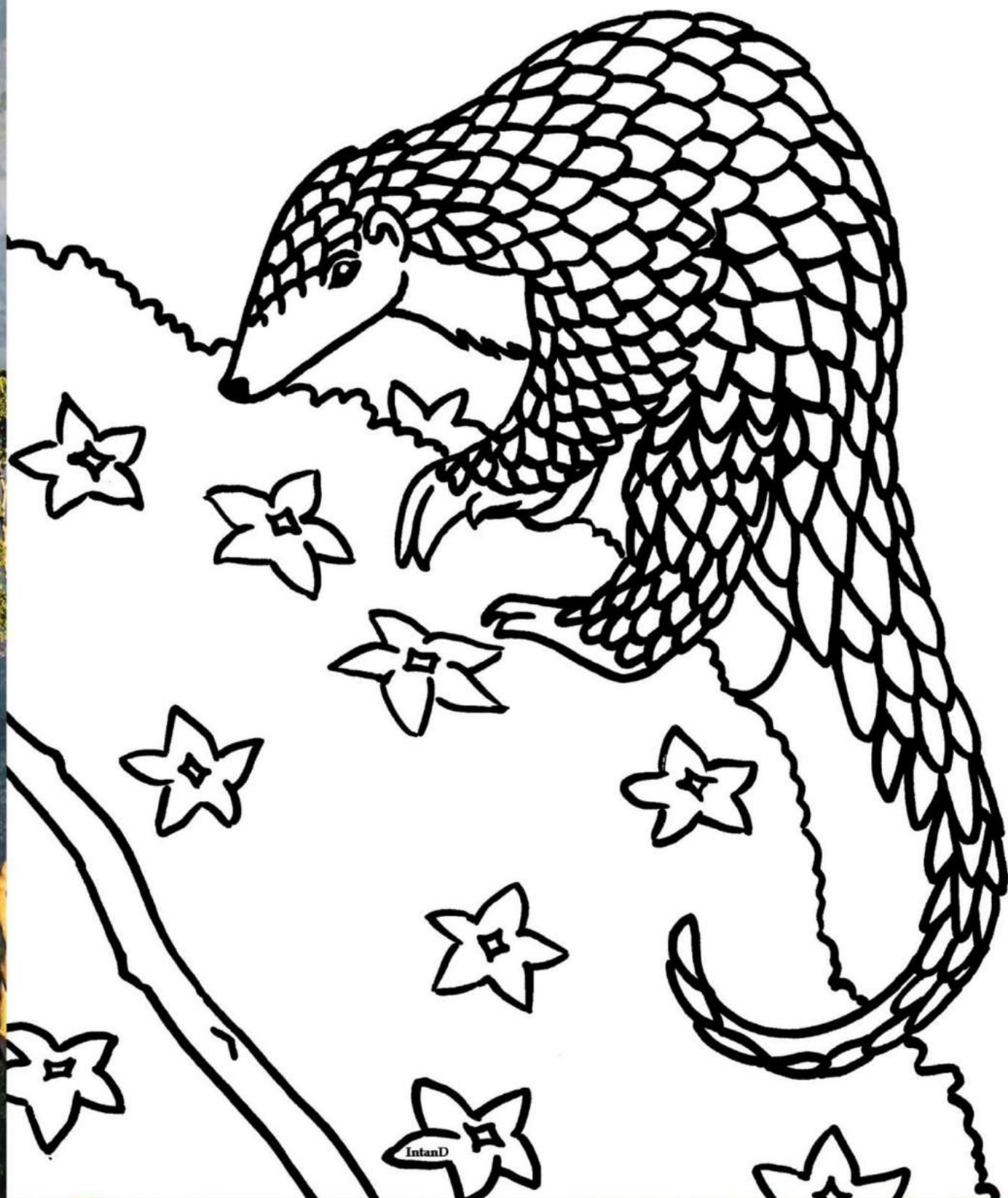

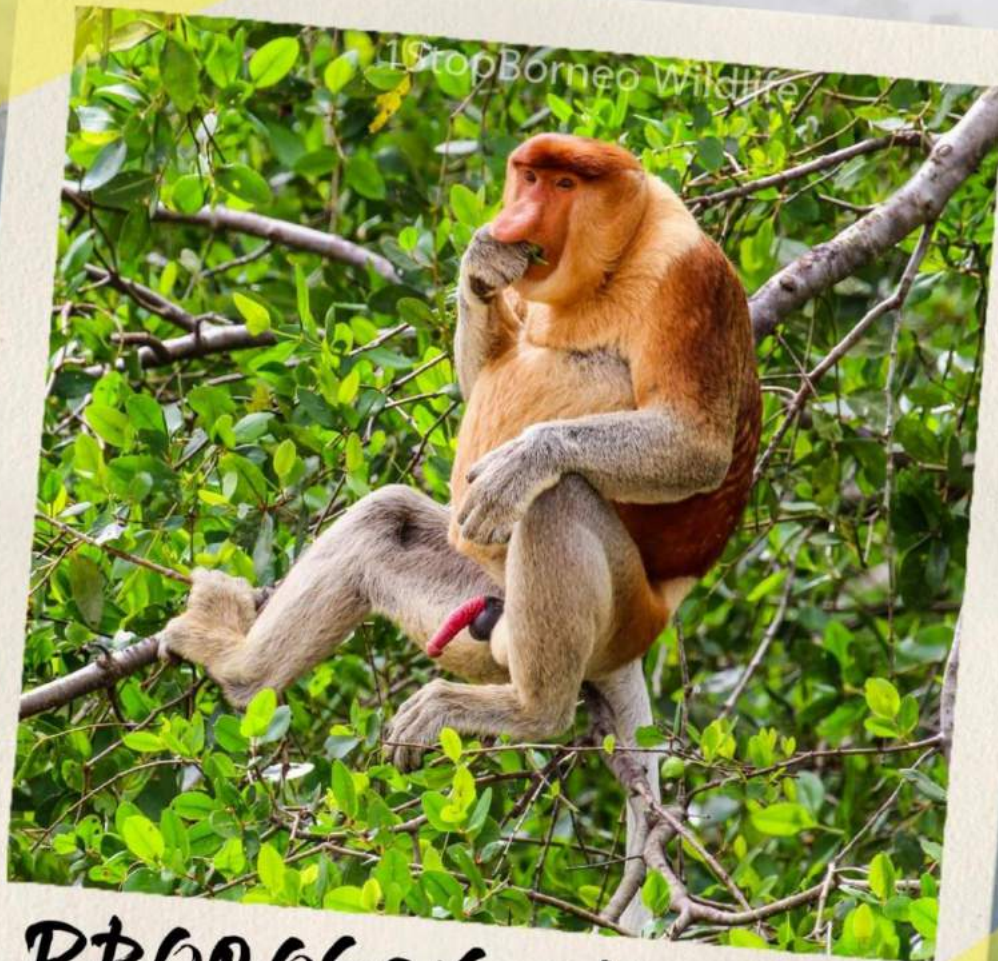
PITCHER PLANT

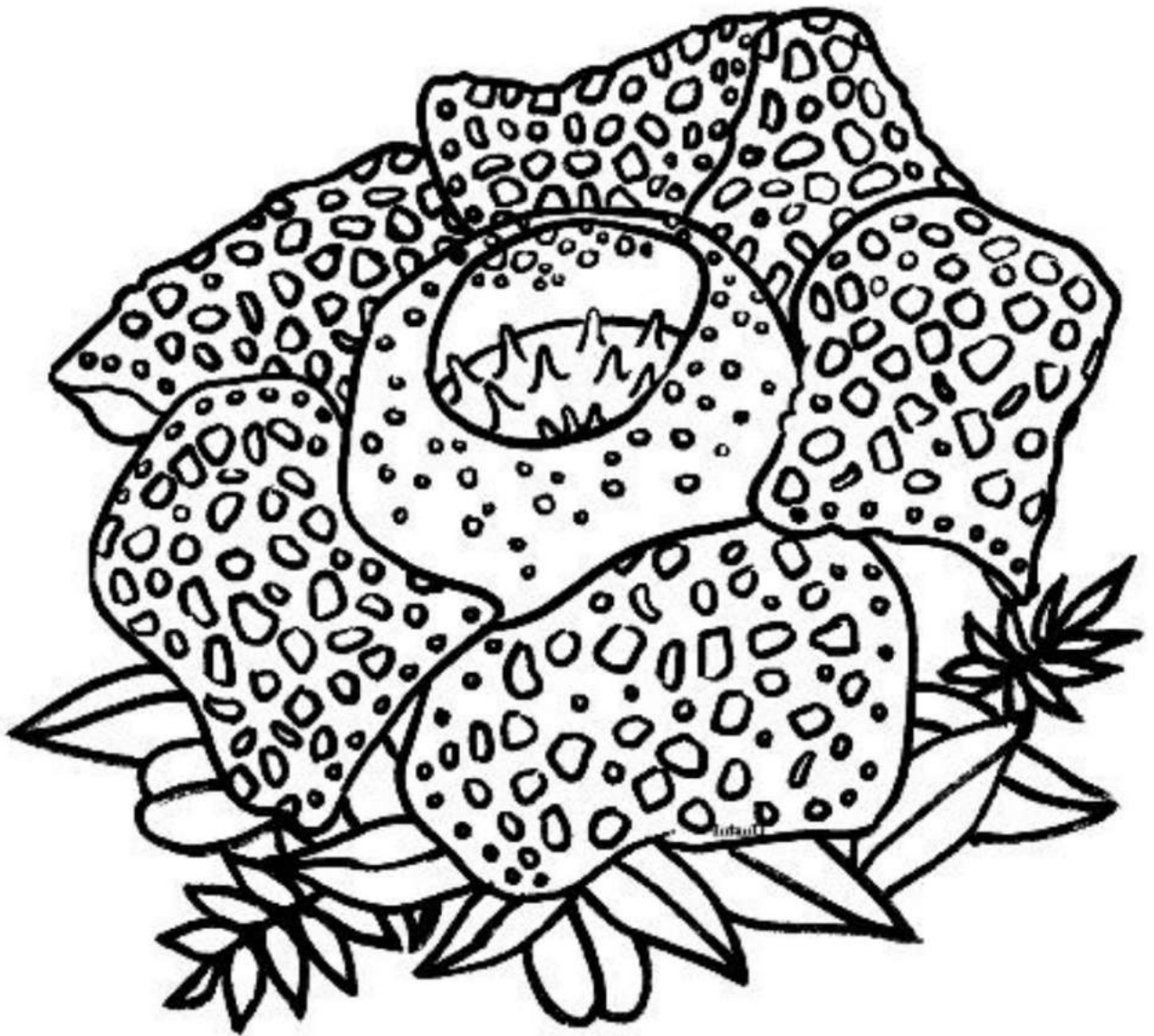


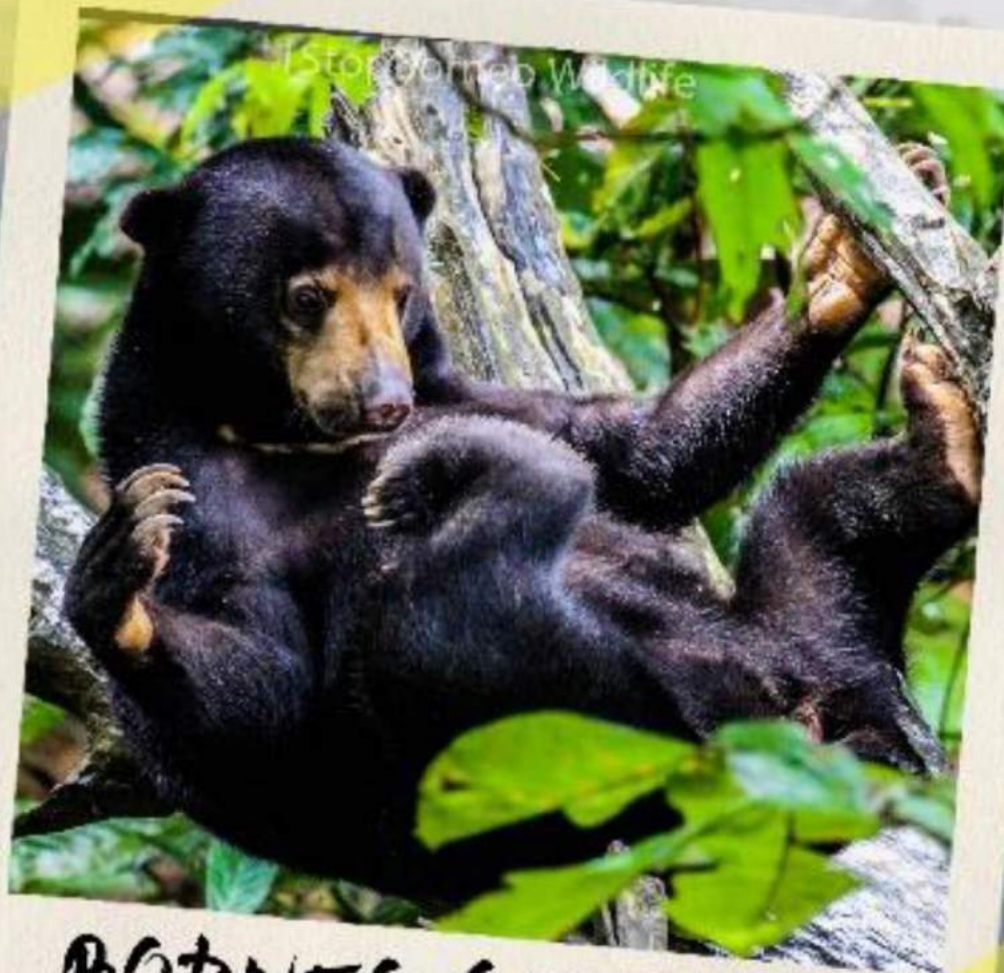
RAPPLESIA

RHINOCEROS HORNBILL

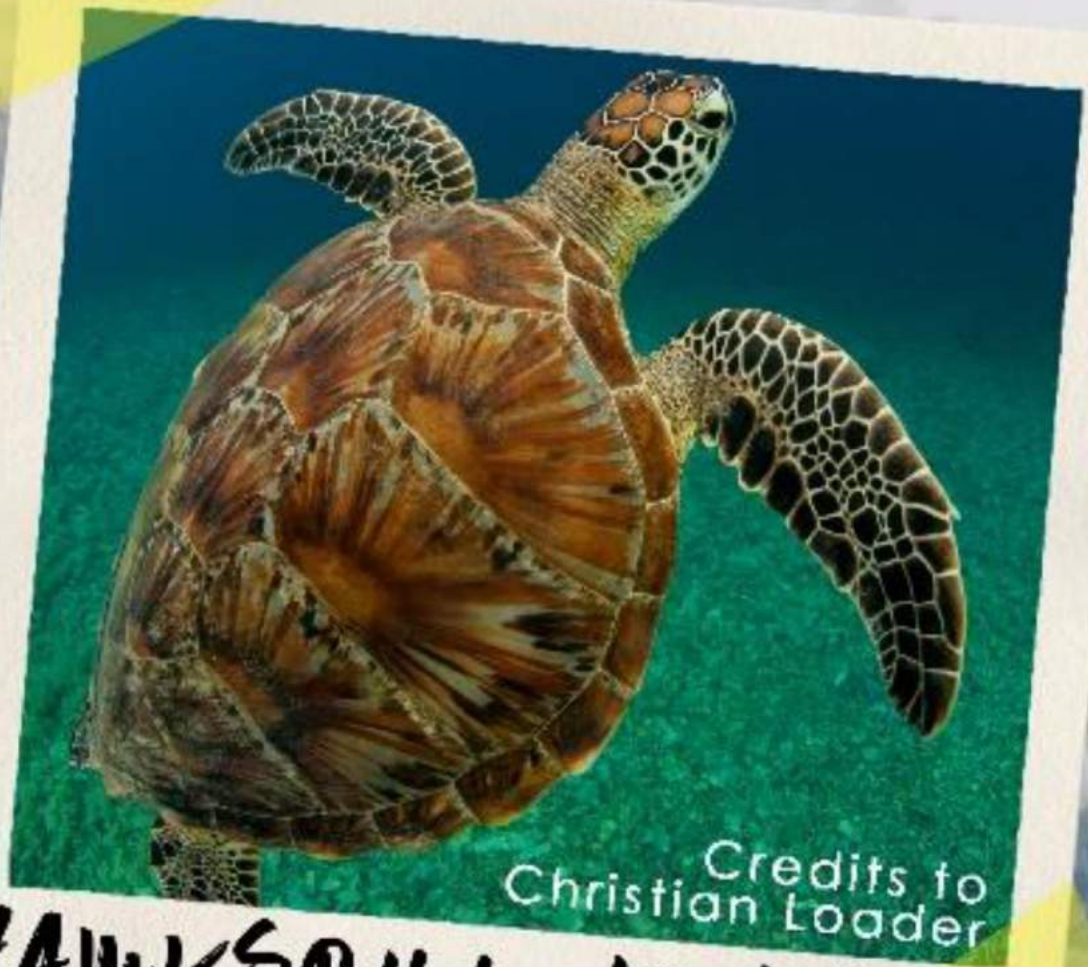
1) Are considered flying farmers of the forest as they disperse seeds away from the mother tree

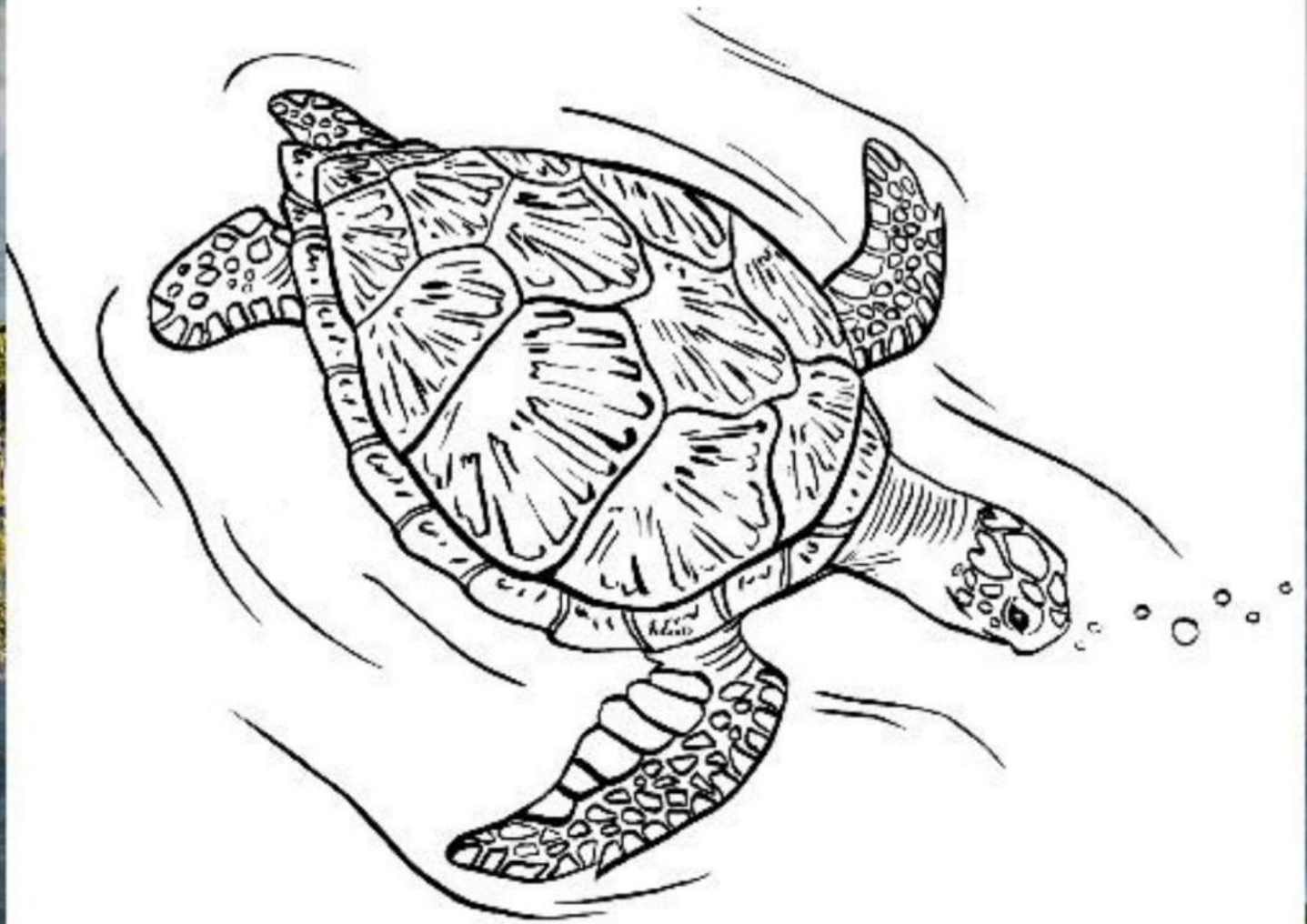


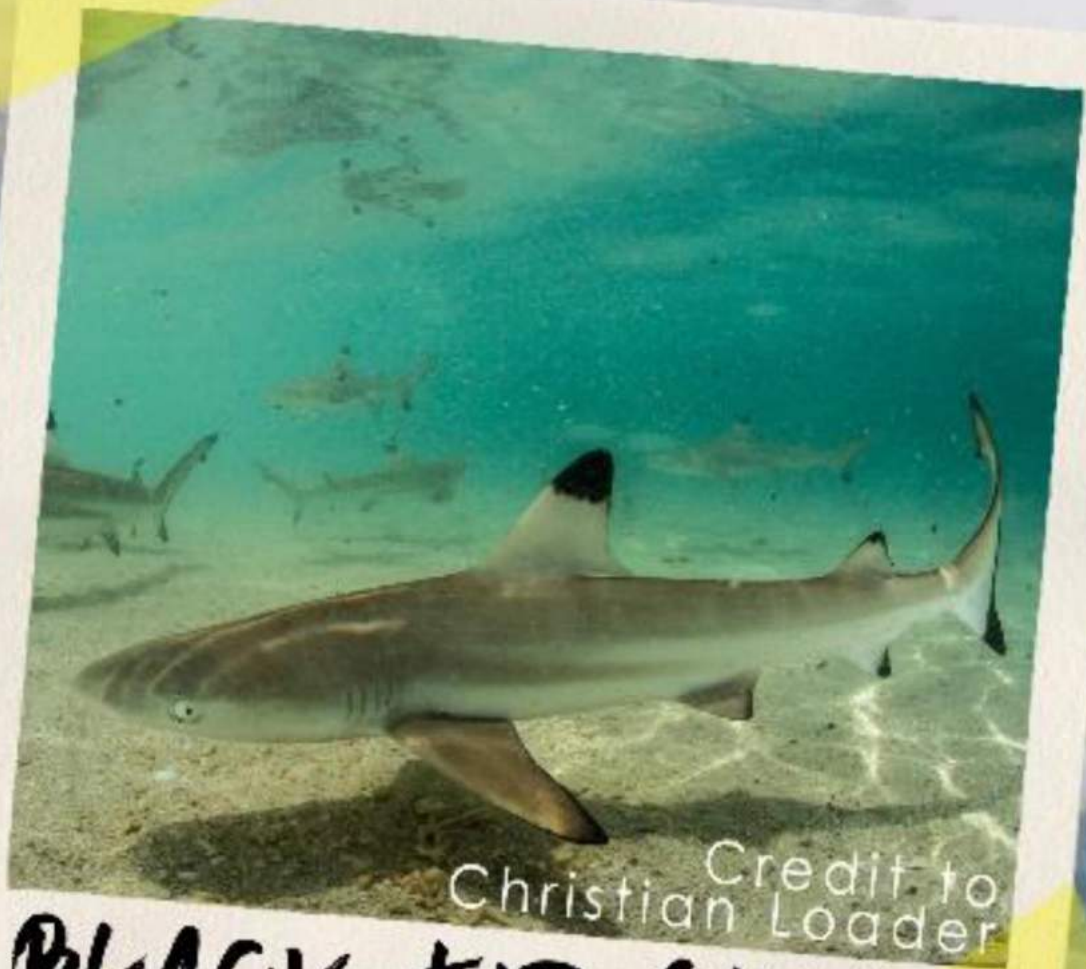

jellyfish





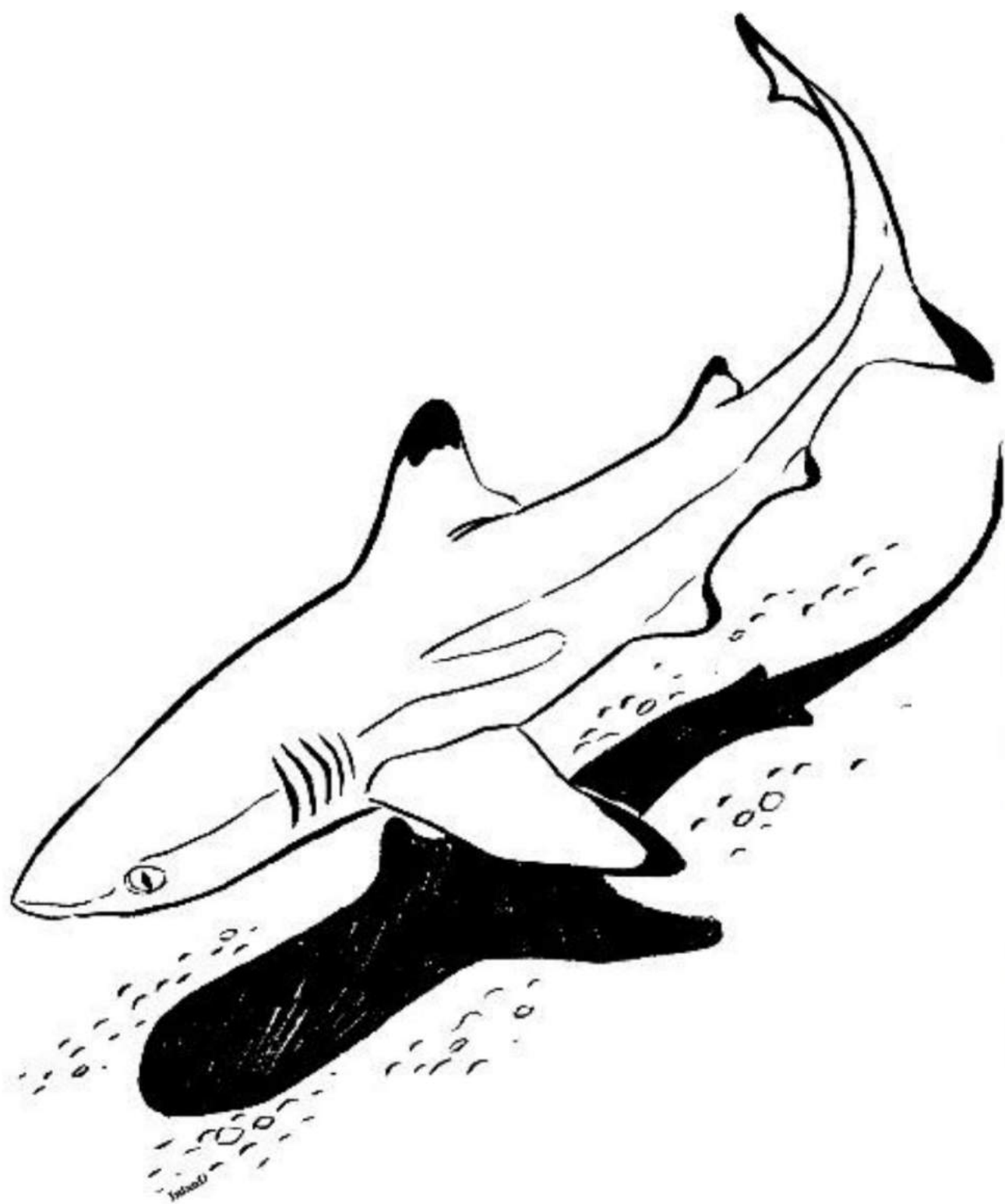

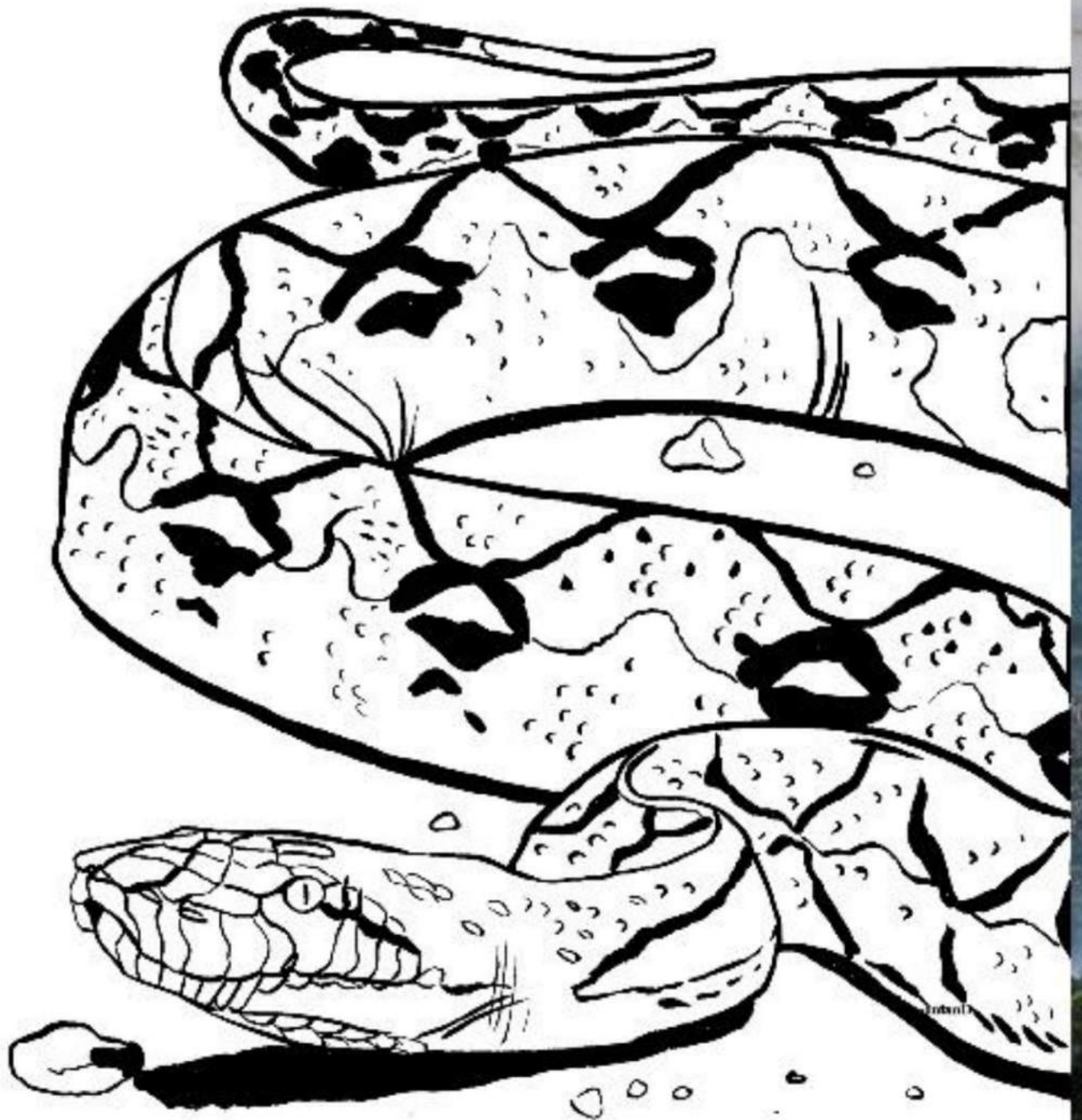


SHORT TAILED PYTHON

1StopBorneo Wildlife is founded in 2012. It is a local organization based in Borneo with the aim of conserving the native wildlife. The current president of the organization is Chun Xing Wong.

1StopBorneo Wildlife practice the unique concept of conservation tourism to save the Bornean wildlife. Several iconic projects were created under this concept: #Plant4BorneoElephants, where tree planting is done in a wildlife corridor to save the elephants; dolphin & proboscis monkey surveys in Sabah, by training fishermen; wildlife rescues in Brunei, to rescue slow loris and pangolins that are being kept as pets or for sale; longhouse-to-longhouse cycling in Sarawak, to create tourism value for the creation of a national park.
